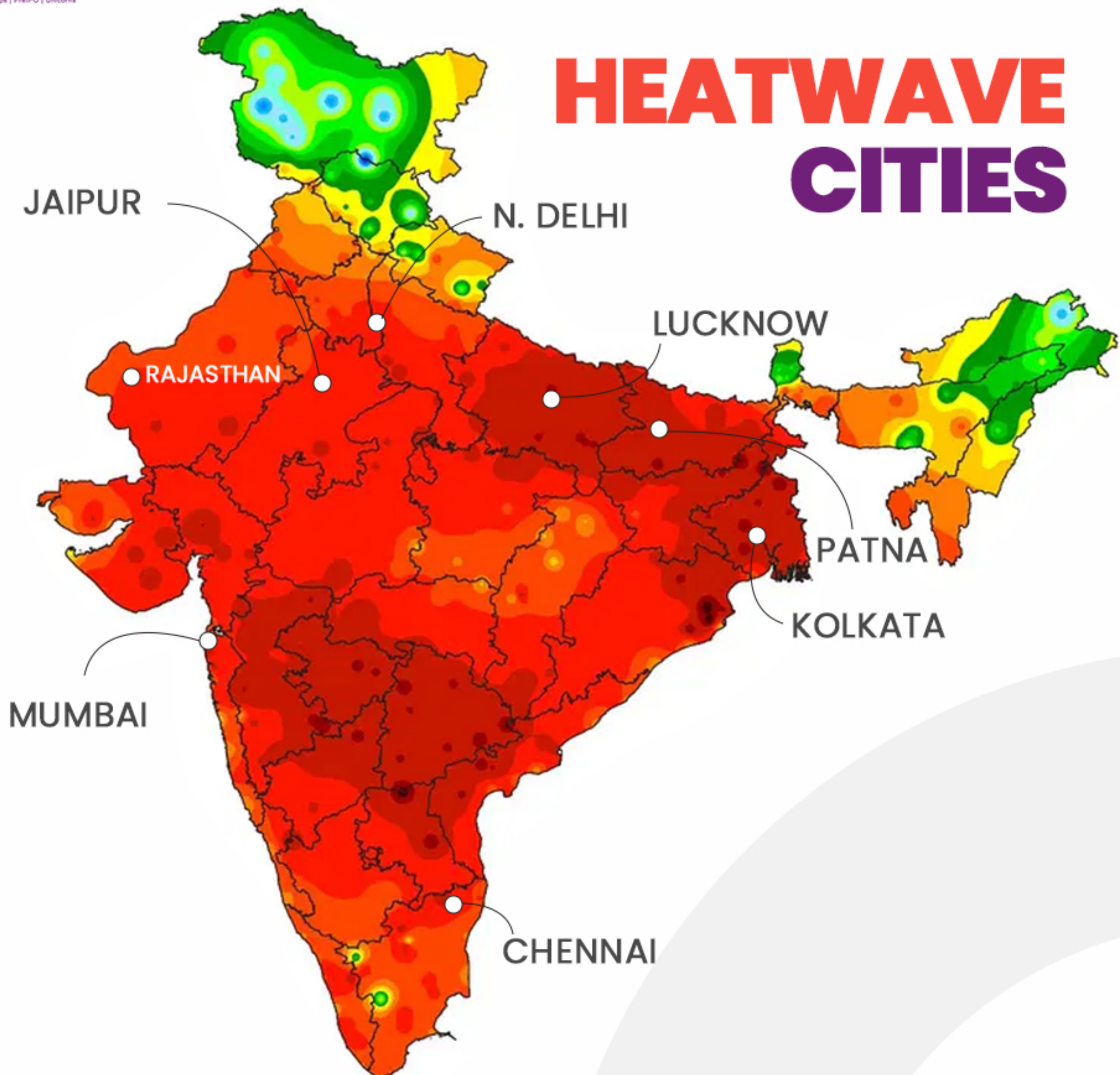

Delhi's city record of **49.2°C** from 2002 had been broken the day before, with temperatures reaching **49.9°C** on **May 27, 2024**



More than **37 cities in the country** recorded temperatures over **45°C**. Warnings of heat-related illnesses have been issued, with at least 56 casualties and 25,000 suspected heat stroke cases.

Extreme **heat** forced schools to close early for the summer in **India**.





The unequal impacts of heat waves, especially with temperatures beyond **50°C** in **dry environments like Delhi**, will affect the most vulnerable, such as the elderly, young children, workers exerting outdoors, people with comorbidities, and the poor with minimal cooling interventions.



Food delivery giant **zomato** has advised customers to avoid ordering during peak afternoon hours to ensure the safety of delivery personnel amidst extreme heat conditions. This move underscores the impact of heatwaves on business operations and highlights the need for adaptive strategies in response to climate challenges.
